 parish hall. We welcome new members.

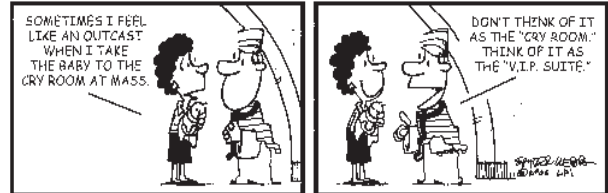
3RD ORDER SERVANTS OF MARY: Meet on the last

If you are interested in having your name placed on the ballot, please call the parish office. **Function of the Council:** Concerned with the overall ministry efforts of a parish and are consultative to the pastor. Specifically, parish pastoral council members are asked to "investigate, reflect and offer best conclusions" to the pastor regarding parish matters. It has the responsibility of promoting the life of the whole parish and is encouraged to become a visioning body through long-range planning. Those who serve on Parish Pastoral Councils should be individuals who are Catholics in good standing, have knowledge of their faith and their own leadership abilities, familiarity with ministry efforts of their parish, familiarity with the mission of the Roman Catholic. **The Role of the Parish Pastoral Council is essentially Pastoral.** The Parish Pastoral participates in the responsibility for pastoral ministry. Its purpose and goals are extensive. It should research the needs, the ideas, the hopes, the life and activity of the people of God, so that the whole parish community can effectively carry out the mission of the parish and fully participate in the ongoing conversion that is central to its life. The Pastoral Council should constantly evaluate the parish in its conformity to the Gospel and those constitutive elements of the shares in the deliberative process which assists the pastor in carrying out the leadership role that is his within the parish.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

Do you wish your prayer to fly toward God? Give it two wings: fasting and almsgiving.

-- Saint Augustine

The law of abstinence obliges those 14 years of age and older not to eat meat.

The law of fast obliges all those from ages 18 through 59 to refrain from eating between meals and to limit their eating to one full meal and two lighter meals for the day.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of both fast and abstinence. In the United States, all Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

As the season of Lent draws near, it is helpful to recall the discipline of the Church in regard to fast, abstinence, and other forms of penance.

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.
2. The Obligation of Abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at the age of 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 19-59. No one should consider this obligation lightly.
3. Those individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting or abstaining may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast or abstain, but should perform some other act of penance or charity.
4. As a general rule, a request of dispensation from the obligation of abstinence on Friday of Lent will not be considered, unless some serious reason is present. The attendance at social events, banquets, wedding rehearsals or receptions are not considered sufficient reasons to request a dispensation.
5. Pastors and parents are to see to it that minors, though not bound by the law of fast and abstinence, are educated in the authentic sense of penance and encouraged to do acts of penance suitable to their age.
6. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to do acts of penance and charity during the Lenten season beyond what is prescribed by law.
7. All members of the Christian Faithful are encouraged to avail themselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation, since it is a true encounter with the loving, forgiving Savior, Who takes away the burden of our sin, forgives our failing and is the source of peace and joy.
