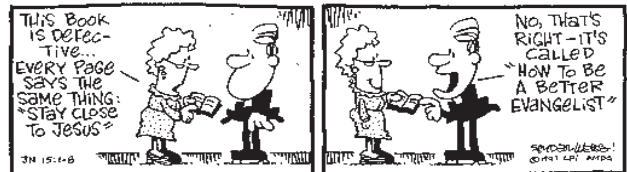

PLEASE NOTE: The Archdiocese of Santa Fe is no longer allowing our parish to have a separate "Building Fund" envelope. As you know, we were also required to omit the Faith Formation envelope. These envelopes are not taxed the 12.5% required by the regular contribution envelope. As of June 1st, all monies will go into our regular fund that supports all parish operations, and the Archdiocese will collect 12.5% of our collections for their expenses. I ask you to **PLEASE** continue to support your parish; if you were donating to our Faith Formation Program, or the Building Fund, or both, I am asking for you to continue to do so with the regular envelope, and any excess monies we have, we will place in our savings, for other parish projects. The Revelation of the Eucharist - continued:
Blood of Christ in Holy Communion. The Communion Rite concludes with a closing prayer.4. Concluding Rite - Following the prayer after Holy Communion, priest blesses the people and dismisses the assembly.

THE REVELATION OF THE EUCHARIST: *The Holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation...The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the People of God by which the Church is kept in being. (CCC, nos 1322 and 1325).* The origins of the Eucharist are found in the Last Supper that Jesus shared with His Apostles. "In order to leave them a pledge of this love, in order never to depart from His own and to make them sharers in His Passover, He instituted the Eucharist as the memorial of His death and Resurrection and commanded His apostles to celebrate it until His return; thereby He constituted them priests of the New Testament" (CCC, no. 1337, citing Council of Trent: DS 1740). 1. **The Introductory Rite** - The Christian community, unity with the Holy Spirit, gathers for worship in response to God's call. The priest acts in the person of Christ, the Head of the Church. All worshipers participate actively with devout attention and with reverence shown by singing, and giving response, and when appropriate observing silence. There are also the deacon, the lectors, those who present the offerings, the extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, the altar servers, the musicians and other ministers. This first movement contains the Introductory Rites, which begins the celebration of the Mass. These include the Penitential Rite, the *Gloria*, and the Opening Prayer. 2. **The Liturgy of the Word** - Over the course of the liturgical year, readings from Scripture, especially the Gospels, provide the heart of this part of the celebration. The proclamation of God's Word and its explanation are meant to arouse our faith and prepare us for an ever deeper participation in the mystery of the Eucharist. The readings are followed by a homily, the Profession of Faith in the recitation of the Creed; and intercessory prayers. 3. **Liturgy of the Eucharist** - a. *The Preparation of the Gifts* (Jesus took bread and wine). The offerings of bread and wine are received by the priest, who may be assisted by a deacon. "They will be offered by the priest in the name of Christ in the Eucharistic sacrifice in which they will become His Body and Blood" (CCC, no. 1350). Collection is taken up at this time. b. *The Eucharistic Prayer* (Jesus blessed and gave thanks). This the heart of the Eucharistic Liturgy, which unfolds in the following manner.

- **Thanksgiving** (expressed especially in the Preface): In this prayer we thank God the Father, through Christ in the Spirit, for the gifts of creation, salvation and sanctification.
- **Acclamation:** The whole congregation joins with the angels and saints in singing or saying the *Sanctus* (Holy, Holy).
- **Epiclesis (Invocation):** The Church implores the power of the Holy Spirit to change the bread and wine offered by human hands into Christ's Body and Blood.
- **Institution Narrative and Consecration:** The priest proclaims Jesus' words at the Last Supper over the bread and wine. "The power of the words and the action of Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit, make sacramentally present, under the species of bread and wine, Christ's Body and Blood, His sacrifice offered on the cross for all" (CCC, no. 1353).
- **Anamnesis (The Remembrance):** We recall the death and Resurrection of Christ and look forward to His glorious return.
- **Second Epiclesis:** The Holy Spirit is invoked upon the gathered community, to bring unity to the worshippers who will receive Holy Communion.
- **Intercessions** With the whole Communion of Saints and all God's people on earth, we pray for the needs of all the members of the Church, living and dead.
- **Doxology and Great Amen:** We conclude the Eucharistic Prayers with praise of God the Father, through His Son Jesus Christ, in the Holy Spirit. This glorification is confirmed and concluded by the people's acclamation "Amen."
- c. **Communion Rite** - (Jesus broke the bread and gave His Body and Blood). After the Lord's Prayer, Lamb of God is sung or said during the breaking of the Body of Christ, then we receive th Body and
