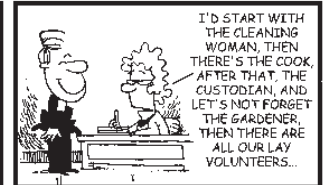
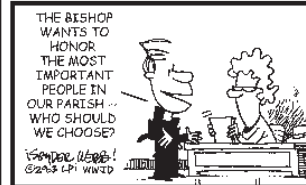

**Archdiocese of Santa Fe:** Archbishop John C. Wester was installed as our 12th Archbishop of Santa Fe on June 4, 2015 in the Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi in Santa Fe, on June 29, 2015, the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul. The liturgical event that recognizes the martyrdom of the two apostles and the foundation of the Roman Catholic Church. Archbishop Wester joined 45 of his newly-named metropolitan archbishop brothers representing 34 countries to meet with Pope Francis, concelebrate Mass and receive their sacred palliums at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. During the Mass, Pope Francis blessed and distributed the palliums, his gift to each archbishop. This was a break from the 32-year-old custom in which the Holy Father previously conferred the palliums on the new archbishops in attendance. **The actual imposition of Archbishop Wester's pallium by the Apostolic Nuncio, to the United States, Archbishop Carlo Maria Viganò, took place on Monday, 5:30 PM, October 5, 2015 at the Cathedral Basilica of St. Francis of Assisi.** Also at this historic event, Archbishop John C. Wester presided at the 14th Annual Archbishop's Award ceremony recognizing men and women who serve their parishes as role models of our Catholic faith through their dedicated service to others. The recipients represent parishes throughout the Archdiocese. During the ceremony Archbishop Wester presented recipients with the prestigious custom-designed medallion. Though they represent a wide range of backgrounds, they are all united by their love for Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, and our rich Catholic faith. Pastors of each parish were invited to submit the names of one individual or one married couple to receive the distinguished award.

**Q** When my grandfather was dying, the priest came and anointed him, and then said he would give him viaticum. What is that?

**A** All during our life, we receive Communion at Mass. Most are the regular Sunday celebrations. Others might have special meaning and purpose: weddings, confirmation, retreats, and funerals. Although it is the same Lord we receive each time, the reason we receive the Eucharist changes and adds special meaning to the sacrament. Whether we are praying for someone, asking for grace, or joining together as a community of faith, the Eucharist sustains us and allows us to join our prayers and sacrifice to the Lord's.

As the hour of our death approaches, the reception of Communion takes on a special purpose. We receive the Lord to accompany us on our journey from this life to the next. Viaticum comes from a Latin word meaning "provision for the journey." It refers to the rite of giving Communion to a person near death. People often think of "last rites" as anointing of the sick, but there are several sacramental rites that we can receive at the end of our life, including penance and Eucharist. The Eucharist is the completion of the Christian's life on earth and the beginning of eternal life.
