take place following the rosary in the parish hall.

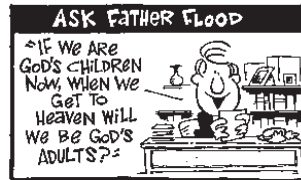

Q What does it mean to discern a vocation? I thought if God wanted someone to be a priest or religious, that person would know when they received "the calling."

A Many priests, sisters, and religious will undoubtedly smile at this thought. The word vocation comes from the Latin word *vocare*, meaning to call. A vocation is a calling or invitation from God to serve in a particular way. For Catholics, that calling might be as a priest, sister, or married person. Vocation is the way we respond to the invitation to share in God's grace and witness to God's love in the world. At times, that can be a difficult choice to make.

Discerning a vocation is the process in which we pray for God's guidance. We listen for God's message that is often quiet and unassuming in a world filled with noise and distractions.

We look at our gifts and talents, seek the advice of others, examine our motives and listen to see what God is asking of us. The goal of discernment is to follow what the Lord wills, not what we think is the best idea. Many men enter a seminary to discern if that is their vocation, only to discover that their calling is to marriage. Others have resisted the idea for long periods of time, until finally they could resist no more. Some great saints have described that dilemma. In spite of what we might see as obvious, the call was not that clear to them. Others resisted, like Augustine, who prayed, "Lord, give me chastity, but not yet!" Vocation is a human process of divine origin and each of us must strive constantly to hear the call of God in our lives.

National Vocation Awareness Week: We all have a call to further the kingdom of God, whether that is as a priest or deacon or for that matter and married or a single person. Each has a call from God and the community to live out our lives in service to another. What is your call?
In Latin, the word "vocare" means to call, to name, or to invoke. As Catholic Christians, we believe that God through the community calls each of us into work for the kingdom of God. We all remember being taught the priests and nuns have a calling. However, since Vatican II the Church has made it clear that we are all called in some way. This week the Church celebrates "National Vocation Awareness Week" (www.usccb.org/beliefs-and-teachings/vocations/national-vocation-awareness-week.cfm). What will you do to support and sustain your call to the mission of Christ and the call of others?

Let us pray..God, who called to the people of Israel, hear our prayer. You have called each of us to be the hands and feet of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ. Help us to tune our ears to your call, the small voice that is always asking us to help spread your good news. We humbly ask that you endow us with the knowledge and skills to help others to see that you are Lord and God.

We ask this through Christ our Lord and brother, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever.

Amen.
